



#### The oil and gas industry makes an important UK wide contribution



Supporting ~206,000 jobs 1 in every 160 UK jobs

26,000 direct 94,500 indirect 85,100 induced 0.6% of the UK workforce


Providing £25bn GVA £12.2bn direct £7.6bn indirect £5.2bn induced 1% of the UK economy

£15bn production taxes in last 2 years. >£15bn in next 5 years


Oil and gas continue to supply ~3/4 of UK energy

The future opportunities for the integrated offshore energy sector are significant Future opportunities in oil and gas, offshore wind, carbon capture, hydrogen



## The UK's energy consumption is changing, but not as quickly as some would think



The UK has 32 million cars

fuelled by petrol and diesel

Domestic oil and gas meets approximately 50% of UK needs



Energy consumption is in long term decline – 28% lower than 2000



In 2050 – oil and gas could represent 22% of UK energy mix – 75% today



By mid 2030's electricity could be the largest source of energy supply




The greatest area of capacity growth will be in the scale-up of offshore wind
